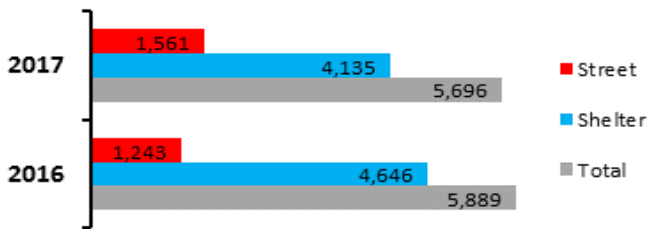

POINT-IN-TIME COUNT OF HOMELESS PERSONS

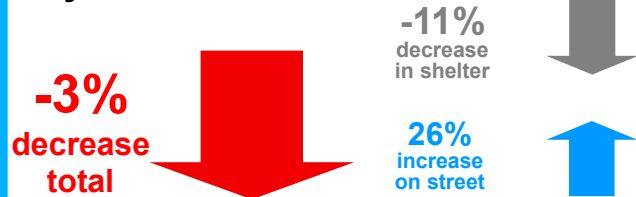

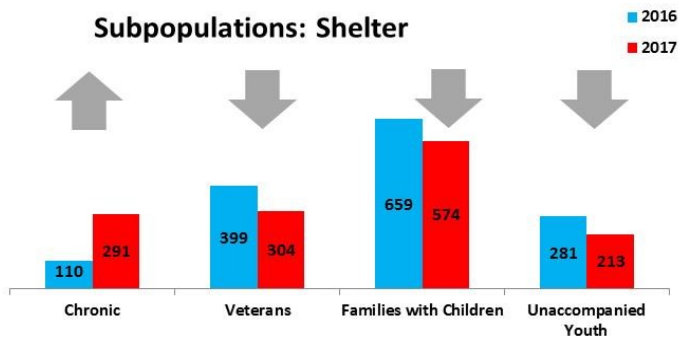

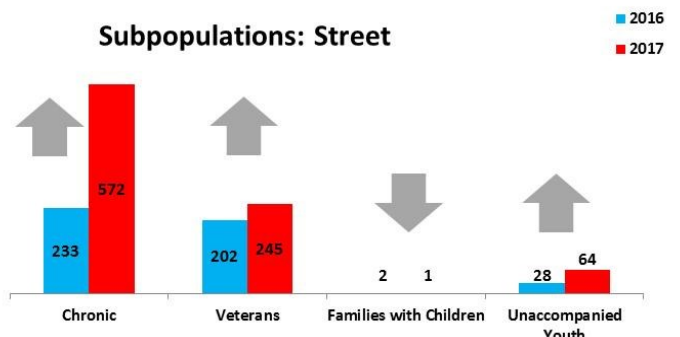

Subpopulations: Shelter

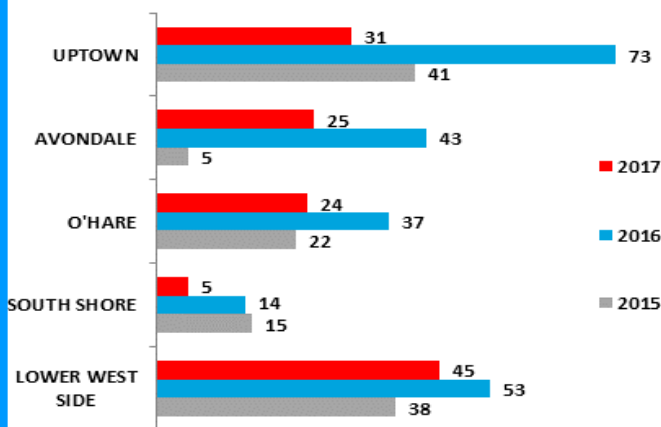


Subpopulations: Street

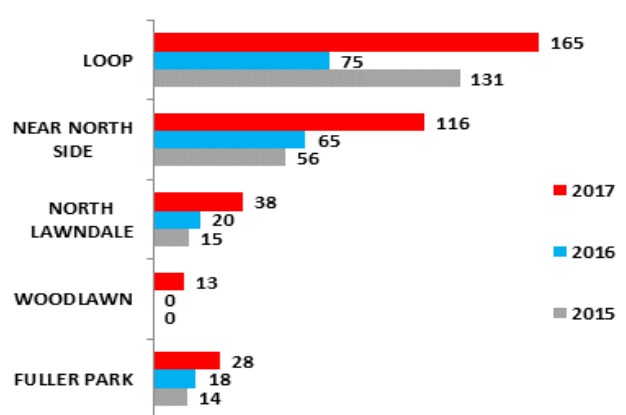

The 2017 PIT Count was conducted with the help of 520 staff and volunteers, an increase of 17% over last year. This helped us collect 40% more surveys on the street. Also, thank you to all the homeless service providers that participated.
