Thurston County Point in Time Count Preliminary Data Report



The Point in Time Count (PIT) is an effort to determine how many people are experiencing homelessness nationwide. The 2024 annual census was conducted through a survey to collect data through outreach, events, and direct service providers. A full report will be released in August 2024. Please note this data is preliminary and is still undergoing a verification process in partnership with the Department of Commerce.










Overview of Unsheltered Individuals*

Where people slept




Where people come from



Households









Where else did people sleep?**

**These individuals are not included in the totals, as they do not meet HUD's definition of homelessness for the PIT count.





What happened during the 2024 PIT count?

- Eight events (Homeless Connect, Resource Fair, Senior Connect, YYA Connect, among others) were held at various locations to connect individuals to services, community resources, gear distribution, and to conduct the survey.
- 82 individuals were surveyed that were doubled-up or couch surfing. These folks do not qualify for inclusion in the formal PIT count, but are considered unstably housed.

- Five individuals were counted staying in jails and hospitals with no permanent address.
- Survival gear distributed to participants at events and through outreach: 1040 hand warmers, 500 rechargeable headlamps, 510 Duffel Bags, 504 pairs of waterproof gloves, 100 blankets, 800 hygiene kits, and over 200 winter jackets and sweaters.
- In partnership with United Way over 20 volunteers participated in supporting events.
